A massive thank you and well done to everyone who took part in the Big Walk and Wheel Challenge 2024. Results will be finalised at the end of April however, from first glance it looks like out of 2266 schools, we were 2^{nd} in Edinburgh, 7^{th} in Scotland and 70^{th} Nationwide. A brilliant result.

Congratulations to Primary 5 and Primary 6 who took part in their Bikeability Level 1 training. This took place in the back playground and pupils were given the opportunity to master their braking, gliding, cranking, signalling and balancing during an intense 2 hour cycling session. Some classes were even joined by our local community police officer, PC Fulton. The weather was on our side which made for an excellent two days. The children loved taking part and were so enthusiastic. A massive well done to everyone who took part!

Talking of bikes...as children grow, it is important they are riding a bike with the right size of frame for them. However, bikes are expensive, and children grow very quickly. I have been in touch with 'The Bike Station Edinburgh' who offer a 'wee bike library' scheme. This allows families to access children's bikes for free and exchange them for the next size up as children grow.
