As you know we had our obstacle course fundraiser back in October and raised almost £3,000 to go towards this which was a fantastic amount. Unfortunately, the estimate we received to complete all the work required on the trim trail totalled nearly £10,000. As a result, we were beginning to think that our only option was to remove the parts that needed replaced instead of repairing them. However, we have been extremely fortunate in that a former pupil of Carrick Knowe PS has stepped forward to make an extremely generous donation to the school, enabling us to have the work on the trim trail carried out. This person wishes to remain 'in the background', but as you can imagine, we are hugely appreciative of this gesture and cannot thank them enough. This enables many, many more Carrick Knowe PS pupils to enjoy our trim trail for years to come.







# Finally.....

As you are all aware, I send out lots of communication around parking safely and keeping all of our children safe.
